Mission Statement

Jeducare Services, Inc. is an education and health care service company that provides quality personal care to individuals with special needs including children with autism spectrum disorder. Our services are rendered in a home and community based setting. We provide services twenty-four hours a day.

Children with autism may have challenges with social, emotional, and communication skills. They might repeat certain behaviors and might not want change in their daily activities. Many people with autism also have different ways of learning, paying attention, or reacting to things. Autism spectrum disorders (ASDs) begin during early childhood and last throughout a person's life.

Identification of Autism: According to The National Center on Birth Defects and Developmental Disabilities, a child or adult with autism might have the following signs and symptoms:

- do not play "pretend" games (play hiding and seek)
- do not point at objects to show interest (point at an airplane flying over)
- do not look at objects when another person points at them

- repeat or echo words or phrases said to them, or repeat words or phrases in place of normal language (echolalia)
- have trouble expressing their needs using typical words or motions
- repeat actions over and over again
- have trouble adapting when a routine changes
- have unusual reactions to the way things smell, taste, look, feel, or sound
- lose skills they once had (for instance, stop saying words they were once using)

If you or your doctor think there could be a problem, ask for a referral to see a developmental pediatrician or other specialist, and you can contact your local early intervention agency (for children under 3) or public school (for children 3 and older).

Our Staff

Our members include licensed professionals and experienced technicians; such as, certified special educator, licensed psychologist, speech therapist, and music therapist. Our technicians are monitored and retrain on a regular basis by our licensed professionals.

Our Services

We provide services to individuals with special needs including children that participate in the autism waiver program in the state of Maryland.

- **Respite Care Services:** The services we provide to the participant includes: Bathing, feeding, dress into sleepwear, and help the child to get into bed for sleep.
- **Family Training:** These are trainings/ services that we provide to a parent/ Guardian of a child with an autism spectrum disorder; when we send out one of our licensed/certified and experienced professionals to a family that desire to know more improved ways of dealing with their child.
- **IISS:** The Intensive Individual Support Services are interventions and supports that are provided on one on one basis by our trained, experienced Technicians who are supervised closely by our certified professional. The services are task and goal oriented. We mostly provide this type of service in the child's home.
- **TI:** Therapeutic Integration Services are Therapeutic-based services that we provide to a child with autism spectrum disorder in our center. Activities that we provide in our center includes: Music and dancing, Arts and craft, Piano class and so on. We take our children to the community on a regular basis for swimming, bowling, soccer games, community recreational parks, parties, movies and eat-out places.
